3 <sup>rd</sup>	and 4 <sup>th</sup> Grade Questions	
1.	What is the Rat Catcher's name?	The Rat Catcher's name is Bill. He also goes by the name Silas.
2.	Find a wheel that turns but goes nowhere.	There are two wheels at the Park that turn but go nowhere, the water wheel at the Grist Mill and the lathe wheel that turns the wood lathe.
3.	Find the biggest piece of metal in the Park.	The biggest piece of metal in the Park is the canon.
4.	Who makes shoes for horses?	The Blacksmith makes shoes for the horses.
5.	Where can you find a pen that come from a goose?	You can find writing pens, called quill pens because they are made from the quill feathers of a goose, in the Print and Post.
6.	Name one of the Rules of the Park.	There are many rules for the Park posted at the front gate. Anyone will answer this question.
7.	Who are Punch and Judy?	Punch and Judy are marionettes or puppets.
8.	What game is played with a hoop and four sticks?	The Game of Graces is played with a hoop and four sticks.
9.	Where can you fill your bucket with water?	The stream coming from the spring is where the villagers fill their buckets with water for drinking, cooking, washing, and turning the water wheel at the Grist Mill.
10	. What kind of oven is used to make bread?	A Dome Oven made from clay is used to bake bread in our Colonial Outdoor Kitchen.
5 <sup>th</sup>	and 6 <sup>th</sup> Grade Questions	
1.	Find two machines in the Park. What are their sources of power?	The two machines in the Park are the Grist Mill, run by water power, and the lathe, which is man powered with the lathe wheel.
2.	Where is the Town Bell located?	The Town Bell is located in the Meeting House which is situated in the middle of town so that it can be heard by all the villagers. It is used to warn of danger, call a town meeting, announce the start of church, etc.
3.	What item in the Cabinet Shop was featured in a Hollywood movie?	The lathe wheel which turns the wood lathe was featured in the movie "The Patriot".
4.	Where would you take your meat to preserve it for the winter?	Without refrigeration, meat was cured and smoked at the Smoke House to keep it edible into the winter months.
5.	Name two of our Founding Fathers who are at the Park.	Two of our "Founding Fathers" visiting us today are President George Washington and Benjamin Franklin.
6.	What is the name of our village?	We live in the Village of Willow Springs, named after the spring that provides us with water.
7.	What is the name of the firearm carried by our Militia?	The Militia men carry Muskets.

Where would you buy ale and spirits?	When you get thirsty for ale, spirits, or any other kind of
